About the Adjudicators

Ben Costello – Music (Wind Strings & Vocal)

Ben Costello BMus PGDip MA FRSA FISM is a freelance musical director, singing coach, accompanist, examiner and adjudicator, working nationally and internationally. He is Artistic Director of Thames Concerts, a busy generalist music adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals, and a music examiner and consultant for London College of Music Examinations.

Ben's work embraces many genres, with a specialism in musical theatre, and he has been musical director on numerous productions across the UK. He has taught at most of the major London colleges including Arts Ed, Mountview Academy, the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art, Guildford School of Acting, Trinity Laban, Laine Theatre Arts, Drama Studio London, the London School of Musical Theatre, Italia Conti, and the Royal Academy of Music. He is also a busy accompanist, working with a variety of singers and instrumentalists in a range of performing environments, and has given concerts throughout Europe.

Born in London, Ben read Music at Kingston University and the London College of Music, subsequently joining the College's faculty as a conductor and vocal coach. His early career also included repetiteur work for the London Symphony Orchestra. He is a Liveryman and Court Member of the Worshipful Company of Musicians and chairs the Company's Jazz Committee.

Ben is delighted to be returning to Suffolk Festival (this will be his fifth visit to adjudicate) and wishes all the performers every success with their musical endeavours this year.

Caroline Clemmow (Piano)

Caroline has a rich and varied musical background. As a violinist she led the Kent Youth Orchestra and was subsequently awarded a piano scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music where she won many prizes. While performing concertos and solo recitals, Caroline derives particular pleasure from the field of chamber music, covering an extremely wide repertoire. She has participated in many London concerts, given numerous broadcasts and played in major festivals.

An important part of her work was the celebrated duo with her husband, Anthony Goldstone, who died in 2017. They were critically acclaimed for their pioneering broadcasts and CDs, building an international reputation. Caroline was also an examiner for the ABRSM for many years, both at grade and diploma levels.

Caroline is also an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals.

Jenny Thornton: (Speech and Drama)

Jenny trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama gaining awards for Character Acting and for Most Promising Teacher. Jenny has led the performing arts teams in large comprehensives, been an Assistant Principal for Edexcel and a LAMDA examiner. She has run her own performing arts school to include drama, dance and musical theatre. She has written plays and one-off monologues and duologues.

Her play called "Gone" gained a Commended when performed at The Orange Tree Theatre in Richmond as did her most recent play "Young Love". She has been delighted that LAMDA chose pieces for their acting anthologies.

Jenny loves adjudicating and making it a very enjoyable and positive experience for all concerned.

Child Protection Policy Statement

About Us

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech (BIFF) works for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

BIFF and our member festivals are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind.

We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our board of trustees, paid staff, adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of BIFF and our member festivals. It has been drawn up on the basis of relevant law and guidance that seeks to protect children and young people, and its purpose is to set out the overarching principles that guide our approach.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual
 orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or
 abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals.
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- appointing a Federation Head of Safeguarding and, for each festival, at least one Festival Safeguarding Officer
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- working within the legislation and guidance that specifically addresses the needs of young performers (specifically, the Children and Young People Acts 1933 and 1963, and the Children (Performance and Activities) (England) Regulations 2014
- adopting a safe and balanced approach to the issue of creating and using photography and images of children and young people at our festivals and in our communications
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

BIFF will review this policy each year in line with NSPCC guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance.













Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to provide safer festivals for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival: Contact: safeguarding@suffolk-festival.org.uk
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice leaflet, Festival Child Protection leaflet, and any other guidance produced by the Federation. This advice is supported by support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Guidance includes clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending/performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel wear a badge to identify their roles. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are

unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take any responsibility for property left unattended.

- 7. We do not permit any unauthorised photography at our Federation Festivals. For further information on what is and is not authorised, please contact the Festival Safeguarding Officer or anyone wearing a festival badge. If any child, young person or parent/carer is concerned about any photography or recording taking place at an event, please contact the Festival Safeguarding Officer, who will be pleased to discuss this matter with you.
- 8. Some children and adults with support needs may need help in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Organisers prior to arrival. The Festival aims to meet these needs wherever possible but must know beforehand in order to prepare support
 - or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and its approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone are published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or adults of any age who may require additional support) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

2. ACCOMPANISTS

There will be no official accompanist. If you need an accompanist please contact one of the recommended accompanists: John Chillingworth, Gretel Dowdeswell and Matt Heyburn. Details are given on the Suffolk Festival website. Booking and payment will be directly between you and the accompanist.

3. TROPHIES & MEDALS

- a) Medals, which are awarded to the winner of the children's classes, may be retained.
- b) Cups, or other trophies which are awarded, may only be retained until the next Festival. The recipient must agree to keep it safe and return it in good condition and return to relevant secretary (see page iv) by 1st February 2027.
- c) The recipient is to pay for any loss or damage caused to trophies whilst in his/her possession or in transit.
- d) Cup Winners may have their names engraved on trophies in keeping with any existing engraving at their own expense.

5. ENTERING AND PERFORMING

5.1 Your entry

- a) We would like to encourage everyone to use the "On Line Entry System" which we feel sure you will find straightforward and convenient to use. It greatly reduces and simplifies the work involved in dealing with entries and also saves on paper & postage.
- b) Entries will be accepted only if the appropriate entry fee is received before the closing date.
- c) Entry fees can be refunded only in exceptional circumstances.
- d) Any entry may be rejected without giving a reason.
- e) Confirmation of entries will be generated at the time of your order by the on line entry system.
- f) Two weeks before the festival you will receive an email notifying you of the class times and schedule.
- g) If you have not received confirmation of your entries or class schedules please contact the festival IT Manager.
- h) In the Speech Vocal and Dance classes you may not enter more than once in the same class unless you are in a group class with different partners.
- i) In the Piano, Strings and Wind classes you may enter up to twice in the age group and grade classes, but you must play a different piece each time.
- j) The same piece may not be performed in more than one class in the same Festival year, or repeated within three years of entry.
- k) Own choice music must be stated as part of your entry, and a copy of what you are performing must be provided for the adjudicator
- I) Any changes to own choice music must be notified by email to music@suffolk-festival.org.uk
- m) Own choice Speech pieces a copy of what you are performing must be provided for the adjudicator. No responsibility is accepted for loss or damage to originals, which should be collected immediately following the class adjudication. Teachers should inform the Speech Secretary speech@suffolk-festival.org.uk of what will be performed by each competitor no later than 7th January 2026. This is for copyright regulations.
- n) Changes made after 7th January 2026 must be notified by email and labels will need to be filled out when you get to the festival, so the correct details are available for the adjudicator etc. Please do this as soon as you arrive at the festival.

- o) Committee members are not allowed to enter the festival on a competitive basis.
- p) Professionals and experienced performers are eligible to enter only the Vocal Open championship all other classes are for amateurs only.

Professionals defined as: those whose income is wholly or in part derived from teaching or performing the particular branch of the performing art in which they are intending to compete.

Experienced performer defined as: anyone over 21 sufficiently experienced to have been asked to perform as a soloist in a major work, for a society with more than 50 performers, or previous winner of the Suffolk Festival Vocal Championship.

5.2 Age Limits

The qualifying age for entrants will be calculated as on 1st January prior to Festival. Adults are defined as anybody 19 years and over, unless otherwise stated.

5.3 Time Limits

You must observe all relevant time limits for performances. The "Performance time" shown is the total time and entrants should note that spoken introductions are included within the quoted timings. If you do not keep to the time limit you may be penalised and may not be placed.

5.4 Own Choice Pieces

You must provide a copy of what you are performing for the adjudicator. No responsibility is accepted for loss or damage to originals, which should be collected immediately following the class adjudication. Teachers should inform the Speech Secretary of what will be performed by each competitor no later than 7th January 2026. This is for copyright regulations.

5.5 Announcing Your Performance

Performers are encouraged to announce their performance.

6. **ADJUDICATOR** CONNECTIONS

No one who is or was a pupil of an adjudicator in the last twelve months may enter a class judged by that adjudicator without the consent of the Chairperson to whom full disclosure of that connection has been made.

7. COPYRIGHT

The Festival will have the necessary copyright performance permissions provided that the identity of any work to be performed has been provided in advance, and that the piece has not been re-arranged without the composer/author's consent. Photocopies may be used for adjudicator's copies only.

8. PERSONAL DATA

We will hold and process your personal data solely for the purposes of the festival and is held under the control of the IT Manager.

For piano, or any string, woodwind or brass instrument.

One or more movements from any Concerto, or a complete Concerto for the chosen instrument.

Entrants are encouraged to bring a pianist to perform the orchestral accompaniment, but if this is impossible, to ask one of the recommended accompanists. For piano concertos which need an accompanist playing the orchestral part on a second piano, you will need to bring a portable keyboard for this purpose as only one piano will be provided.

ME 53 JAZZ AND POP SOLO

Entry Fee - £12

Any Age

Not to exceed 7 minutes.

Own Choice

For any instrument including Voice but excluding Organ.

Jazz should include some improvisation.

ME 54 JAZZ AND POP SOLO

Entry Fee - £9

14 yrs & under

Not to exceed 5 minutes.

Own Choice

For any instrument including Voice but excluding Organ.

Jazz should include some improvisation.

ME 55 MIXED JAZZ AND POP ENSEMBLES

Entry Fee - £14

Any Age

Minimum of 3 and maximum of 10 performers

Not to exceed 8 minutes.

Own Choice

For any combination of mixed stringed, woodwind or brass instruments, including piano and percussion. The ensemble must have between three and ten players. Each player must be playing an independent part, ie no part may be doubled. Any style of jazz or pop is acceptable.

ME 56 MIXED JAZZ AND POP ENSEMBLES

Entry Fee - £14

14 yrs & under

Minimum of 3 and maximum of 10 performers

Not to exceed 8 minutes.

Own Choice

For any combination of mixed stringed, woodwind or brass instruments, including piano, guitar and percussion. The ensemble must have between three and ten players. Each player must be playing an independent part, i.e. no part may be doubled. Any style of jazz or pop is acceptable.

ME 50 MIXED ENSEMBLES INCLUDING VOICE

Entry Fee - £14

Any Age
